# MISSION TRIP TO CHINA

My name is Meng (pronounced *Mong*) and I am from China. I was born in a very poor family. My grandmother on my father's side, who was a Buddhist, hated the fact that I was not a boy because she believed that girls were useless. So when my mother gave birth to me, she kicked us out & left us without a home. In order to make a living, my father had to work far away from us in another province (ZHEJIANG), so it was just my mom and me at home most of the time. We suffered a lot of verbal/non-verbal abuse from my grandmother and other relatives. Life was tough, and it became worse when my mother died of cancer when I was 18. At that time, I had to prepare for my university admission exam, so she didn't want me worrying about her and losing focus of my educational goals. My entire life was suddenly full of sadness and bitterness. I felt desperate, and life became meaningless to me. I remember hearing my uncle tell my dad at the funeral, "Now you can go marry a young woman and have a son". They often called me an "orphan" and treated me even worse. My heart broke into pieces and I found myself drifting into a world without love and hope.

Before I came to the U.S., I didn't know anything about God until I met a Christian lady from Thailand in the summer of 2011 and my life was totally changed because of her love. I soon met more Christians and their premise for helping me was, "We love because Jesus loves us". I began to be touched by God's love and saw a glimmer of hope ahead of me. For the first time in a long time, I felt love! I took a Bible back to China with me, and within a few months I noticed a difference in my life. Before, I couldn't sleep at night, but after consistently reading His Word I began to feel an overwhelming sense of peace and joy. I accepted Jesus on Christmas of 2011 and began my new life in Christ. By God's calling, I came back to the U.S. in the summer of 2012. It was then I learned more about Jesus and started growing from the infant stage of my spiritual walk with God. I decided that I wanted to stay here and not go back to the life I had before. So, I began praying for God to open the door for me to go to college here. Because we didn't have health insurance, my dad had to spend all of our money paying off hospital debt. The reality was that there was no way for us to pay for tuition. Then a miracle happened. God provided wonderful people who blessed me with everything I needed from transportation to tuition and a place to stay with every financial need covered. I started praying for my dad to come watch me graduate. The visa was difficult for him to get, but by God's providential grace he was able to be here. That was his first time to experience the love from all the people that impacted me. The best part of it all was that my dad got saved and was baptized the day before he returned home to China.

After graduation, I began praying to stay because I only had one year left before I would have to go back to China. A turning point in my life was when I decided not to give God options to let me stay, but to surrender to His will. I began praying that He would show me a reason to stay or help me accept the fact I had to go back to China. Again, through His great providence, God allowed me to stay by sending my husband (Justin). With the help of all of our friends and family, our wedding was held on August 20, 2016. Since then, our little family has grown to four (Jayden, 3 & Micah, 1.5).

Reflecting on all the help I received, God gave me a desire to help other international students like me by showing them the love of God – that's when we started our new ministry, Hope 3:16. There have been students of various nationalities that we have reached, but I have a heart for helping Chinese students. Through others, and us, they have heard about Jesus and even got to take a Bible home with them. I never understood why I had to go through the things I did, but everyone encouraged me and told me that God gave me a strong testimony that would inspire other people. When I share my testimony with these Chinese students, it affirms my calling to this ministry. He has worked a lot of miracles in my life and He has taught me, through Jeremiah 29:11, that I can trust Him because He's the one who holds my future. Now I feel that my life has never been more wonderful because I believe that no matter what happens around me, I will always find comfort in God's presence. Looking back on every need He has provided and how far He has brought me, I know that He has a plan for my life and I am willing to serve Him wherever He calls me.

Over the last 11 years (2013-2024), we have reached over 300 Chinese students. Nearly 50 of them were saved and baptized before they returned to China. We reach out to them by helping them with transportation, cooking Chinese food for them, taking them to places like church & the Great Smoky Mountains, and sharing the Gospel with them. We have given out over 200 bibles and devotionals. Several students heard about Jesus for the first time and were moved by the grace of God. They went home to tell their families about their experience here & what they learned about God. Some students even found a church in China to attend.

We are gearing up to go back to China this year, so I am raising \$8,000 for mission trips while I am in China.

• \$5000 will cover domestic airline tickets, lodging, and any other expenses.

• \$3000 is to purchase fine Chinese- English bibles from Singapore and donate to churches that those J1 students attend.

• I plan to visit 5 cities, 64 students that I invested in from 2011-2019. Twenty two of them were saved and some are previous J1 students who got married and have children. Over the last few years, I have kept close touch with them and they invited me to meet with their families and visit their churches.

I appreciate you reading this brief overview of my story of how God not only brought me out of a desperate situation, but used me to reach others who are waiting to hear about the hope they can find in Jesus. This is my passion, and I'm humbled that God would take my story of brokenness and turn it into a blessing for those that need to hear it.

This trip will be from July 8th - October 17th. If you feel led to support me financially, I can take cash, Venmo (@Hope\_316), or you may write a check to Hope 3:16.
