Reset Explained

"Walking Forward with Hope"

There's something powerful about turning the calendar to January. A new year invites us to pause, reflect, and take a deep breath. It feels like a clean slate. The past year, with all its joys and struggles, now rests behind us, and we stand at the threshold of something new.

For some, this sense of newness brings excitement and renewed energy. For others, it may come with lingering weariness or unanswered questions. Either way, Scripture reminds us that our hope is not rooted in a date on the calendar, but in the unchanging faithfulness of God.

Lamentations 3:22–23 tells us, “Because of the Lord’s faithful love we do not perish, for His mercies never end. They are new every morning; great is Your faithfulness.” That promise is just as true on January 1st as it is on any other day of the year ... God does not run out of mercy and He does not grow tired of meeting us where we are. Each day welcomes us with grace.

The new year is also a reminder that God is always at work, making things new. In 2 Corinthians 5:17 we read, “Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has passed away, and see, the new has come.” While circumstances may not change overnight, God continues to renew our hearts, our minds, and our calling as we walk with Him.

As we step into this year, my encouragement is simple: walk forward with hope. Release what you cannot control. Lay down the burdens you were never meant to carry alone. Invite God into your plans, your prayers, and your daily rhythms, trusting that He will lead you with wisdom and grace.

And for those who feel strong and hopeful right now, this is also an opportunity to encourage others. A word of kindness, a prayer, or a simple reminder of God’s faithfulness may be exactly what someone else needs to begin this year with hope.

May this new year not just feel different, but draw us deeper into the presence of God. His mercies are new, His love is steady, and His purposes for His people continue to unfold.


